

Students have been using their creative art and writing skills to develop a Mother's Day craft that represents their appreciation for the significant role their mothers play in helping them to learn and grow.




3B attended their first Cross Country carnival held at Avery Park in Week 2. They were able to wear their house colours and participated in a range of athletic activities.



# We're committed to being child-centred and dad-focused.

This means that we act in the best interests of your children, and we get there by focusing on you, their fathers. Together, we'll make connections and build skills that will benefit everyone in your families and communities.

### Your privacy matters to us.

Please be assured that all personal information is respected and protected. There will be no disclosure without your permission, unless required by law (for example, to protect someone from harm).



### Our parenting groups.

We have 6 free groups that run weekly, for up to 8 weeks. You'll meet at a South West Sydney location that's close to public transport, to learn new skills and make new friendships with other dads. Morning tea is also included.

### **Keeping Children Safe**

This program is designed to assist fathers in understanding how to protect and care for their children. You'll be equipped with ways to talk to your children about their safety and wellbeing. Runs for 6 weeks

### Triple P - Positive Parenting Program

This evidence-based program focuses on positive parenting, using different strategies to help you reflect on what you're doing now. Runs for 8 weeks

### **Circle of Security**

As part of this group, you'll be shown how to build strong and meaningful attachment with your children, creating the foundation for their future as they explore, make mistakes and learn about the world.

# Runs for 8 weeks Tuning in to Kids

This program is all about understanding your children's emotions, behaviour and the brain. You'll learn techniques to help you connect and chat with your children, and we'll

show you how to respond in accepting and supportive ways. **Runs for 6-8 weeks** 

## Dads Tuning in to Kids

This version of Tuning in to Kids is tailored especially for fathers. It focuses on the important role that dads play in their children's lives, and how you can tune in to their emotions. Runs for 6-8 weeks

### **Tuning in to Teens**

This program helps you understand your children's behaviour during their high school years. You'll learn skills to help you connect and show empathy when your teens are experiencing changes in all areas of their lives. **Runs for 6-8 weeks**
