#### **World Teachers' Day**

#### **COVID-19 - Stay home if unwell**

COVID-19 is still active in the community. While COVID-19 remains an unpredictable virus, NSW Health advises that COVID-19 will continue to present a health risk to the community. Accordingly, schools will continue to implement baseline COVID-smart measures to help reduce the risk of transmission for students and staff members. These key COVID-smart measures include:

- staying home if unwell, and only attending school when symptom free
- consider doing a Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) for symptomatic students and staff
- people exposed to COVID-19 should follow NSW Health guidance and should consider doing a RAT to identify infection early even if they are not experiencing any symptoms
- strongly encouraging COVID-19 vaccinations for students, staff and their families, including a booster shot (when eligible)
- good hygiene practices including regular hand washing
- maintaining natural ventilation, with consideration of local environmental circumstances
- recommending staff and visitors to wear a mask when working with or visiting Schools for Specific Purposes (SSPs), support units or schools with students who are at greater risk of serious illness should they contract COVID-19 particularly indoors and when physical distancing is not possible
- assessing risk and applying appropriate safeguards across activities and events

If your child does test positive to COVID-19, please let the school know.

#### **School Uniform Policy**

#### **Selective High School Applications Now Open**

Attention Year 5 parents and carers: The applications have now opened for Year 7 entry into a Selective High School in 2025. Most students in selective high schools enjoy learning more when their classmates have similar abilities and interests. To apply, complete the online application. Applications close on 20 November 2023. Once the application has been submitted and processed, your child will be allocated to a test centre to sit the Selective High School Placement Test on 9 May 2024. If you have a child who needs to start Kindergarten in 2024 please complete an <u>online enrolment</u> as soon as possible or you can also come to the school for a paper enrolment form. It is never too early to enrol and enrolling early will assist the school to prepare transition programs. *For enrolment you will need to bring:* 

- Child's original birth certificate or passport
- Proof of address e.g., original of council rates notice, residential lease or electricity account
- Parents born overseas please bring original passport or citizenship papers.
- Current Immunisation History Statement

## Class Report - K/6J


#### Welcome to Term 4 in K/6J!

K/6J have enjoyed coming back to school for the last term in 2023!


Our class has been working on making sentences from pictures and improving our handwriting skills! We focus on different sounds each week and we practise our spelling lists daily.

All students in K/6J love getting active every week with Fit futures and also practising dancing in class.











## K-2 Excursion to Casula Powerhouse

## Selective High School Applications Now Open

Selective high school Year 7 entry in 2025—applications open 9 October to 20 November 2023.

<u>Selective high schools</u> provide a learning environment designed for academically gifted and high potential students. They help students learn by:

- grouping them with other gifted students
- using specialised teaching methods so students can learn at a quicker pace and in more detail
- supporting their unique wellbeing needs.

Most students in selective high schools enjoy learning more when their classmates have similar abilities and interests.

Research shows that students benefit both academically and socially from the learning environment in selective high schools. Selective high schools are unzoned so you can apply no matter where you live.

#### Where are they located?

There are 47 selective high schools for Year 7 entry in NSW with:

- 17 selective high schools
- 25 partially selective high schools
- 4 agricultural selective high schools (3 that offer boarding)
- Aurora College, for rural and remote students available in 182 authorised host schools.

Check the <u>selective high school map</u> to find one near you. Or look up the <u>selective</u> high schools list.

#### Is a selective high school the right fit for my child?

If your child learns quickly, asks complex questions, has a good memory or is intensely focused in their area of interest, then a selective high school might be a great fit. Discuss the opportunity with your child and look through the information together on <u>Selective high schools – Year 7</u> and in the new <u>student resource hub.</u>

Fair and equitable access

The <u>Equity Placement Model</u> helps make access fairer for more high potential students in our community.

We know that some students may be missing out because they experience educational disadvantage.

## Selective High School Applications Now Open

Under the Model, up to 20% of student places at each selective high school are held for: • students from low socio-educational advantage backgrounds

- Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander students
- students from rural and remote locations
- students with disability.

These students can be offered a place if their test performance is within 10% of the lowest general applicant first-round offer for the school.

#### The application process

Complete the online application.

Applications close on 20 November 2023.

Once the application has been submitted and processed your child will be allocated to a test centre to sit the Selective High School Placement Test on 9 May 2024. Selective high school places are offered based on students' test performance (academic merit). 

## **Compulsory school attendance**

#### Information for parents

Education for your child is important and regular attendance at school is essential for your child to achieve their educational best and increase their career and life options. NSW public schools work in partnership with parents to encourage and support regular attendance of children and young people. When your child attends school every day, learning becomes easier and your child will build and maintain friendships with other children.

## What are my Legal responsibilities?

Education in New South Wales is compulsory for all children between the ages of six years and below the minimum school leaving age of 17 years. The Education Act 1990 requires that parents ensure their children of compulsory school age are enrolled at, and regularly attend school, or, are registered with the NSW Education and Standards Authority for home schooling.

Once enrolled, children are required to attend school each day it is open for students.

## The Importance of arriving on time

Arriving at school and class on time:

- Ensures that students do not miss out on important learning activities scheduled early in the day
- Helps students learn the importance of punctuality and routine
- · Give students time to greet their friends before class
- Reduces classroom disruption

Lateness is recorded as a partial absence and must be explained by parents.

## What if my child has to be away from school?

On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include:

- being sick, or having an infectious disease
- · having an unavoidable medical appointment
- being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- exceptional or urgent family circumstance (e.g. attending a funeral)



## Attendance

#### NSW Department of Education

Following an absence from school you must ensure that within 7 days you provide your child's school with a verbal or written explanation for the absence. However, if the school has not received an explanation from you within 2 days, the school may contact you to discuss the absence.

Principals may decline to accept an explanation that you have provided if they do not believe the absence is in the best interest of your child. In these circumstances your child's absence would be recorded as unjustified. When this happens the principal will discuss their decision with you and the reasons why.

Principals may request medical certificates or other documentation when frequent or long term absences are explained as being due to illness. Principals may also seek parental permission to speak with medical specialists to obtain information to collaboratively develop a health care plan to support your child. If the request is denied, the principal can record the absences as unjustified.

#### Travel

Families are encouraged to travel during school holidays. If travel during school term is necessary, discuss this with your child's school principal. An Application for Extended Leave may need to be completed. Absences relating to travel will be marked as leave on the roll and therefore contribute to your child's total absences for the year.

In some circumstances students may be eligible to enrol in distance education for travel periods over 50 school days. This should be discussed with your child's school principal.

## My child won't go to school what should I do?

You should contact the principal as soon as possible to discuss the issue and ask for help. Strategies to help improve attendance may include a referral to the school's learning and support team or linking your child with appropriate support networks. The principal may seek further support from the Home School Liaison Program to develop an Attendance Improvement Plan.

## What might happen if my child continues to have unacceptable absences?

It is important to understand that the Department of Education may be required to take further action where children of compulsory school age have recurring numbers of unexplained or unjustified absences from school.

Some of the following actions may be undertaken:

· Compulsory Schooling Conferences

You may be asked, along with your child, to attend a Compulsory Schooling Conference. The conference will help to identify the supports your child may need to have in place so they attend school regularly. The school, parents and agencies will work together to develop an agreed plan (known as Undertakings) to support your child's attendance at school.

 Application to the Children's Court – Compulsory Schooling Order

If your child's attendance at school remains unsatisfactory the Department may apply to the Children's Court for a Compulsory Schooling Order. The Children's Court magistrate may order a Compulsory Schooling Conference to be convened.

· Prosecution in the Local Court

School and Department staff remain committed to working in partnership with you to address the issues which are preventing your child's full participation at school. In circumstances where a breach of compulsory schooling orders occurs further action may be taken against a parent in the Local Court. The result of court action can be the imposition of a community service order or a fine.

## What age can my child leave school?

All New South Wales students must complete Year 10 or its equivalent. After Year 10, and up until they reach 17 years of age, there are a range of flexible options for students to complete their schooling.

#### **Working in Partnership**

The NSW Department of Education recognises that working collaboratively with students and their families is the best way to support the regular attendance of students at school.

We look forward to working in partnership with you to support your child to fulfil their life opportunities.
