Meet the teacher

It was fabulous to see the parents and caregivers who attended the Meet The Teacher sessions last week. We thank those who could attend. We had 151 adults attend the meetings to learn about the curriculum and events that occur at FWPS and to meet their child's teacher.

Permission Notes

Over the past two weeks there have been permission notes for Fit Futures and Online applications. It is extremely important that those notes are signed and returned as soon as possible. Please contact the office or Rania if you haven't returned them and you need more information.

Cyber safety

Social media is constantly changing and evolving. It can be hard to keep track of what platforms are most popular with your child and their friends. Therefore, cyber security is very important now that the internet is becoming part of everyday life. It is important to remember that most online applications have an age restriction, and many require account holders to be **over 13 years of** age. This means that students in primary school should not have an account for applications such as Facebook, Instagram, and Snapchat.

When you look up the requirements for online applications, you will find the following:

- Facebook requires everyone to be at **least 13 years old** before they can create an account (in some jurisdictions, this age limit may be higher). Creating an account with false info is a violation of terms. This includes accounts registered on the behalf of someone under 13.
- Instagram requires everyone to be at least 13 years old before they can create an account.
- Snapchat is a platform for 13+ users.
- TikTok is only for those aged at least 13 years old.

Please support the school in promoting the safe use of online applications with children. The following points can help remind your children how to stay safe online:

- Don't give out personal information about yourself or your family
- Only talk to people you know
- Think carefully before you click send
- Be careful about what you buy online
- Talk to an adult if you feel worried

Helping your family stay safe online

Children can learn, explore, play and make friends online. But there can be risks.

Your child might accidentally see upsetting content, be contacted by strangers or experience bullying. They might also miss out on important things like spending time outside.

Here are some easy things you can do to help keep children safe online.

Talk about online safety as a family

Let your child know they can always come to you if something happens online that makes them feel scared or upset.

You can ask your child to show you the games and apps they use. Use eSafety's conversation starters to help you get started.


Set up family rules together

As a family, you can choose some easy rules to help keep everyone safe online. You can include things like where devices can be used, what games and apps your children can use, and how much time can be spent online. Most devices and apps have features to set limits on how they are used. Watch this video to learn more about parental controls and settings.

Know where to get help

If you need help with an online issue and you are not sure what to do, talk about it with someone you trust, like a friend or a teacher at your child's school. You can also speak to someone at Parentline for help with parenting challenges. The eSafety Commissioner (eSafety) helps to keep all Australian families safe online. The eSafety website has more information about reporting online abuse and staying safe online.







مساعدة عائلتك على البقاء بأمان على الإنترنت

يمكن للأطفال التعلم والاستكشاف واللعب وتكوين صداقات عبر الإنترنت. ولكن قد تكون هناك مخاطر.

فقد يرى طفلك عن طريق الخطأ محتوى مزعجًا، أو يتواصل معه غرباء أو يتعرض للتنمر. وقد يفوتون أيضًا أمور هامة مثل قضاء الوقت في الخارج.

فيما يلى بعض الأمور السهلة التي يمكنك القيام بها للمساعدة في الحفاظ على سلامة الأطفال عبر الإنترنت.

التحدث عن السلامة عبر الإنترنت كعائلة

أخبر طفلك أنه يمكنه دائمًا أن يأتي إليك في حال حدوث أمر عبر الإنترنت يجعله يشعر بالخوف أو الانزعاج.

اطلب من طفلك أن يريك الألعاب والتطبيقات التي يستخدمها. استخدم محادثة <u>eSafety</u> للمبتدئين لمساعدتك على البدء.

تحديد قواعد الأسرة معًا

كعائلة، يمكنك اختيار بعض القواعد السهلة للمساعدة في الحفاظ على سلامة الجميع عبر الإنترنت. يمكنك تضمين أمور مثل مكان استخدام الأجهزة، والألعاب والتطبيقات التي يمكن لأطفالك استخدامها ومقدار الوقت الذي يمكن قضاؤه عبر الإنترنت. تحتوي معظم الأجهزة والتطبيقات على ميزات لوضع قيود على كيفية استخدامها. يمكنك مشاهدة هذا الفيديو لمعرفة المزيد عن الضوابط والإعدادات الأبوية.

Gate Times

The school gates are automated for student safety. They are open at **8.30am-9.10am and 2.50pm-3.10pm.** If you would like to enter the premises during the day when the gates are closed, please press the buzzer on the main gate on Palmerston Road (Cumberland Hwy) and you will be let in to come to the office for assistance. If for any reason you cannot drop off or pick your child up at the agreed times, please contact the front office. Children **should not** be standing outside the school gates for significant lengths of time prior to 8:30am.

School hats for Fit Futures on Wednesdays

The school has engaged a company to teach Dance to Kindergarten and Support Unit students on Mondays. On Wednesdays the company is teaching Fundamental Movement Skills to all other grades and K/6D. The sporting sessions are held on the back oval and all students must have a school hat to participate. Please remind your child to always have a school hat in their bag. If a student does not have a school hat, the school will lend them one for the sessions and it will be washed and dried after each use.

Kindergaten enrolments – BEING TAKEN NOW

If you have a child who needs to start Kindergarten in 2024 please complete an online enrolment as soon as possible or you can also come to the school for a paper enrolment form. After you enrol you will also be called to come with your child to the school for an interview. It is never too early to enrol and enrolling early will assist the school to prepare transition programs and events.







Class Report - 1 R

Compulsory school attendance

Information for parents

Education for your child is important and regular attendance at school is essential for your child to achieve their educational best and increase their career and life options. NSW public schools work in partnership with parents to encourage and support regular attendance of children and young people. When your child attends school every day, learning becomes easier and your child will build and maintain friendships with other children.

What are my Legal responsibilities?

Education in New South Wales is compulsory for all children between the ages of six years and below the minimum school leaving age of 17 years. The Education Act 1990 requires that parents ensure their children of compulsory school age are enrolled at, and regularly attend school, or, are registered with the NSW Education and Standards Authority for home schooling.

Once enrolled, children are required to attend school each day it is open for students.

The Importance of arriving on time

Arriving at school and class on time:

- Ensures that students do not miss out on important learning activities scheduled early in the day
- Helps students learn the importance of punctuality and routine
- Give students time to greet their friends before class
- Reduces classroom disruption

Lateness is recorded as a partial absence and must be explained by parents.

What if my child has to be away from school?

On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include:

- · being sick, or having an infectious disease
- having an unavoidable medical appointment
- being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- exceptional or urgent family circumstance (e.g. attending a funeral)



Attendance

Following an absence from school you must ensure that within 7 days you provide your child's school with a verbal or written explanation for the absence. However, if the school has not received an explanation from you within 2 days, the school may contact you to discuss the absence.

Principals may decline to accept an explanation that you have provided if they do not believe the absence is in the best interest of your child. In these circumstances your child's absence would be recorded as unjustified. When this happens the principal will discuss their decision with you and the reasons why.

Principals may request medical certificates or other documentation when frequent or long term absences are explained as being due to illness. Principals may also seek parental permission to speak with medical specialists to obtain information to collaboratively develop a health care plan to support your child. If the request is denied, the principal can record the absences as unjustified.

Travel

Families are encouraged to travel during school holidays. If travel during school term is necessary, discuss this with your child's school principal. An Application for Extended Leave may need to be completed. Absences relating to travel will be marked as leave on the roll and therefore contribute to your child's total absences for the year.

In some circumstances students may be eligible to enrol in distance education for travel periods over 50 school days. This should be discussed with your child's school principal.

My child won't go to school what should I do?

You should contact the principal as soon as possible to discuss the issue and ask for help. Strategies to help improve attendance may include a referral to the school's learning and support team or linking your child with appropriate support networks. The principal may seek further support from the Home School Liaison Program to develop an Attendance Improvement Plan.

What might happen if my child continues to have unacceptable absences?

It is important to understand that the Department of Education may be required to take further action where children of compulsory school age have recurring numbers of unexplained or unjustified absences from school.

Some of the following actions may be undertaken:

· Compulsory Schooling Conferences

You may be asked, along with your child, to attend a Compulsory Schooling Conference. The conference will help to identify the supports your child may need to have in place so they attend school regularly. The school, parents and agencies will work together to develop an agreed plan (known as Undertakings) to support your child's attendance at school.

 Application to the Children's Court – Compulsory Schooling Order

If your child's attendance at school remains unsatisfactory the Department may apply to the Children's Court for a Compulsory Schooling Order. The Children's Court magistrate may order a Compulsory Schooling Conference to be convened.

Prosecution in the Local Court

School and Department staff remain committed to working in partnership with you to address the issues which are preventing your child's full participation at school. In circumstances where a breach of compulsory schooling orders occurs further action may be taken against a parent in the Local Court. The result of court action can be the imposition of a community service order or a fine.

What age can my child leave school?

All New South Wales students must complete Year 10 or its equivalent. After Year 10, and up until they reach 17 years of age, there are a range of flexible options for students to complete their schooling.

Working in Partnership

The NSW Department of Education recognises that working collaboratively with students and their families is the best way to support the regular attendance of students at school.

We look forward to working in partnership with you to support your child to fulfil their life opportunities.
