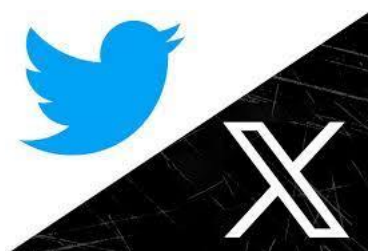

It is never too early to enrol and enrolling early will assist the school to prepare transition programs and events.

For enrolment you will need to bring:

- ***Proof of address e.g., original of council rates notice, residential lease or electricity account.***
- ***Parents born overseas please bring original passport or citizenship papers.***
- ***Current Immunisation History Statement***

Tell Them From Me Survey

This term, Fairfield West Public School will be participating in the *Partners in Learning* parent survey, another part of the *Tell Them From Me* suite of surveys (student, teacher and parent surveys) on student engagement. The survey asks parents and carers questions about different factors that are known to impact on student wellbeing and engagement.

EDUCATION WEEK

Stage 2 Excursion

On Tuesday 19 September the Stage 2 students travelled to Lizard Log park as part of the Western Sydney Parklands 'Bring Back the Bush' program. Despite the hot weather, the students had an educational day participating in a range of activities. The students planted seedlings to create a new shaded area in the park. They learnt to dig a hole, fill the hole with the plant and extra soil, water the plant and finally how to add a layer of mulch. Students looked at animal habitats within the park including the dam which they found was home to many creatures, big and small. The students also learnt Aboriginal customs, threw a boomerang and participated in ochre body painting. The students were well behaved and thankful to Western Sydney Parklands who provided this free excursion.



FAIRFIELD NETWORK ABORIGINAL CHILDREN'S DAY EXCURSION

On Thursday 21 September, some of our Aboriginal students in years 3-6 attended the Fairfield Network Aboriginal Children's Day excursion at Georges River Environmental Education Centre. This was the first Children's Day excursion in the Fairfield network, where all the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students from local schools came together to connect and learn about localised Aboriginal history and culture.

ACTIVITIES

Artefacts & Stories

Students enjoyed this interactive session where they learnt about different artefacts used in the Aboriginal culture, and listened to stories shared by Uncle Bob, who is an Aboriginal Elder.



Aboriginal Education



Artworks



Students learnt about the materials and techniques used by Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander artists. They ground up ochre with water and used this to create their own artworks. Then, students used charcoal to add in details.

Bushwalking

Nic took students on a bush walk around the river to share his stories and knowledge about native flora and fauna. Students learnt about some of the traditions and customs of the different Clans in the Darug Nation.



Indigenous Games

Students learnt about various hunting tools, like the boomerangs, woomeras and spears, and how they were used to catch food. They used frisbees and ball throwers to mimic the action used to throw spears in a traditional woomera.

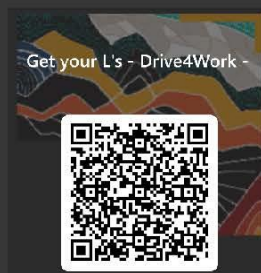

Compulsory school attendance

Information for parents

Education for your child is important and regular attendance at school is essential for your child to achieve their educational best and increase their career and life options. NSW public schools work in partnership with parents to encourage and support regular attendance of children and young people. When your child attends school every day, learning becomes easier and your child will build and maintain friendships with other children.

What are my Legal responsibilities?

Education in New South Wales is compulsory for all children between the ages of six years and below the minimum school leaving age of 17 years. The Education Act 1990 requires that parents ensure their children of compulsory school age are enrolled at, and regularly attend school, or, are registered with the NSW Education and Standards Authority for home schooling.

Once enrolled, children are required to attend school each day it is open for students.

The Importance of arriving on time

Arriving at school and class on time:

- Ensures that students do not miss out on important learning activities scheduled early in the day
- Helps students learn the importance of punctuality and routine
- Give students time to greet their friends before class
- Reduces classroom disruption

Lateness is recorded as a partial absence and must be explained by parents.

What if my child has to be away from school?

On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include:

- being sick, or having an infectious disease
- having an unavoidable medical appointment
- being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- exceptional or urgent family circumstance (e.g. attending a funeral)

Attendance

NSW Department of Education

Following an absence from school you must ensure that within 7 days you provide your child's school with a verbal or written explanation for the absence. However, if the school has not received an explanation from you within 2 days, the school may contact you to discuss the absence.

Principals may decline to accept an explanation that you have provided if they do not believe the absence is in the best interest of your child. In these circumstances your child's absence would be recorded as unjustified. When this happens the principal will discuss their decision with you and the reasons why.

Principals may request medical certificates or other documentation when frequent or long term absences are explained as being due to illness. Principals may also seek parental permission to speak with medical specialists to obtain information to collaboratively develop a health care plan to support your child. If the request is denied, the principal can record the absences as unjustified.

Travel

Families are encouraged to travel during school holidays. If travel during school term is necessary, discuss this with your child's school principal. An Application for Extended Leave may need to be completed. Absences relating to travel will be marked as leave on the roll and therefore contribute to your child's total absences for the year.

In some circumstances students may be eligible to enrol in distance education for travel periods over 50 school days. This should be discussed with your child's school principal.

My child won't go to school what should I do?

You should contact the principal as soon as possible to discuss the issue and ask for help. Strategies to help improve attendance may include a referral to the school's learning and support team or linking your child with appropriate support networks. The principal may seek further support from the Home School Liaison Program to develop an Attendance Improvement Plan.

What might happen if my child continues to have unacceptable absences?

It is important to understand that the Department of Education may be required to take further action where children of compulsory school age have recurring numbers of unexplained or unjustified absences from school.

Some of the following actions may be undertaken:

- **Compulsory Schooling Conferences**

You may be asked, along with your child, to attend a Compulsory Schooling Conference. The conference will help to identify the supports your child may need to have in place so they attend school regularly. The school, parents and agencies will work together to develop an agreed plan (known as Undertakings) to support your child's attendance at school.

- **Application to the Children's Court – Compulsory Schooling Order**

If your child's attendance at school remains unsatisfactory the Department may apply to the Children's Court for a Compulsory Schooling Order. The Children's Court magistrate may order a Compulsory Schooling Conference to be convened.

- **Prosecution in the Local Court**

School and Department staff remain committed to working in partnership with you to address the issues which are preventing your child's full participation at school. In circumstances where a breach of compulsory schooling orders occurs further action may be taken against a parent in the Local Court. The result of court action can be the imposition of a community service order or a fine.

What age can my child leave school?

All New South Wales students must complete Year 10 or its equivalent. After Year 10, and up until they reach 17 years of age, there are a range of flexible options for students to complete their schooling.

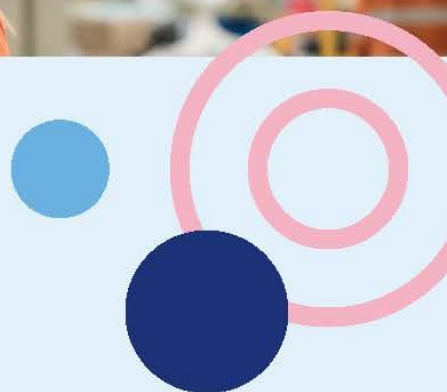
Working in Partnership
